



Trans Mountain Expansion






- \$6.8-billion capital cost*
- Expand capacity to 890,000 bpd
- Project scope
 - 980 kms new pipe
 - 12 new pump stations
 - 19 new tanks
 - 3 new tanker berths
- Increase in tanker traffic not tanker size
- Westridge and Burnaby Terminals construction
- Project has received approvals
- 15- and 20-year contracts with shippers
- \$8.5-million Community
 Benefit Agreements

Trans Mountain Construction Schedule*



 - 1,000 commitments to stakeholders and communities








Construction Proximate to Barriere

Project Status and Next Steps



- Q1 / Q2 2017:
 - Final cost estimate review with shippers
 - Final investment decision (FID) by the Kinder Morgan Board of Directors
- Q1 Q3 2017: Continue to refine engineering, complete field work and planning for construction execution
- Q2 2017 Q1 2018: Contractors Employment and Procurement Plan implementation.
- September 2017: Construction start clearing, temporary sites and HDDs of high-risk crossings
- Late 2019: In-service
- 2019 2020+: Reclamation and post-construction monitoring
