They reflect the overall social and economic context within which Project construction is occurring and present a picture of the overall social and economic vulnerability or resiliency of the region related to the socio-economic monitoring topic areas. Data is being reported for the entire region, even though construction activity may only be occurring in a select portion of the region. These data will be updated during Project construction when new data becomes available. This report also provides a one-time update of select community-level data points for communities crossed by the Project footprint that have been updated since the finalization of the Forject construction period.

Context Indicators

In this region, the Project is occurring in a predominantly rural area. The population of the communities traversed by the Project in this region is over 60,000 with a labour force of over 35,000, with a wider regional population of approximately 275,000 and regional labour force of over 201,000. There is other development in the region occurring, totaling over \$265 million of capital investment. The current and anticipated Project workforce is very small in the context of this region.
