Introduction

This report presents the context indicators associated with the TMEP Yellowhead Region, updated to reflect the October to December (Q4) 2020 monitoring period. They reflect the overall social and economic context within which Project construction is occurring and present a picture of the overall social and economic vulnerability or resiliency of the region related to the socio-economic monitoring topic areas. Data is being reported for the entire region, even though construction activity may only be occurring in a select portion of the region. These data will be updated during Project construction when new data bocupdated since the finalization of the Socio-Economic Effects Monitoring Plan based on the 2016 Census of Canada; this data is only updated every 5 years, so will not be updated during the Project construction period.

Context Indicators

There is other development in the region occurring, totaling over \$11.9 billion of capital investment. The current and anticipated Project workforce is very small in the context of this region.
