Indigenous Monitors on the Trans Mountain Expansion Project – Overview

The Trans Mountain Expansion Project (the Project or TMEP) is retaining Indigenous Monitors as integrated members of its construction Environmental Inspection team. Indigenous Monitors work with Environmental Inspectors to monitor compliance with approved mitigation measures to minimize impacts to traditional resource use and cultural/heritage sites during construction.

Construction activities related to the Trans Mountain Expansion Project in Jasper National Park and Mount Robson Provincial Park, and West Barriere Region are mechanically complete. Cleanup and reclamation activities along disturbed portions of the construction right-of-way and temporary access trails (shoo-flies) have also been completed.

Operations and maintenance work, including integrity digs and sleeve replacements occurring along the deactivated pipeline segments in the Jasper National Park, Mount Robson Provincial Park and West Barriere Region is not part of TMEP nor subject to TMEP Conditions. The Project Construction Progress Report (Condition 106) for May 2023, which reports environmental events and deficiencies in Tables 4 and 5 respectively, is found [here](#).

The Project has a process for sharing information related to potential Traditional Land Use (TLU) and Heritage Resource chance finds during construction. Applicable Indigenous groups are notified and engaged directly on potential chance finds.
