Reporting Period: October - December 2018


This report reflects the August 30, 2018 Federal **Court of Appeal Decision** cancelling the Order in Council, which had approved a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity related to the Trans Mountain **Expansion Project. Projections*** include workers required to suspend construction-related activities on the Project in a safe and orderly manner.

Trans Mountain is monitoring the impact of construction on pipeline communities through a series of indicators identified in the Socio-**Economic Effects Monitoring** Plan. This construction impact information is gathered for each three-month period in a regional Socio-Economic Monitoring Report. Highlights from the quarterly regional report are provided here.


Workers On-Site Each Day (Average)
