

Monitoring Socio-Economic Impacts of Construction

Reporting Period: April-June 2019


On June 18, 2019, Trans Mountain received its new Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN). However, this report reflects the August 30, 2018 Federal Court of Appeal Decision cancelling the 2016 Order in Council, which had approved a CPCN related to the Trans Mountain Expansion Project. Information in this report reflects activity required to suspend construction on the Project in a safe and orderly manner.

Trans Mountain is monitoring the impact of construction on pipeline communities through a series of indicators identified in the Socio-Economic Effects Monitoring Plan. This construction impact information is gathered for each three-month period in a regional Socio-Economic Monitoring Report. Highlights from the quarterly regional report are provided here.


Workers On-Site Each Day (Average)
