#### Introduction

This report presents the context indicators associated with the TMEP Yellowhead Region, updated to reflect the April to June (Q2) 2023 monitoring period. These data are from public and government sources. They reflect the overall socia-economic context within which Project construction is occurring and present a picture of the overall social and economic vulnerability or resiliency of the region related to the socio-economic monitoring topic areas. Data is being reported for the entire region, even though construction activity may only be occurring in a select portion of the region. These data will be updated during Project construction when new data becomes available. This report also provides a one-time update of select community-level data points for communities crossed by the Project footprint that have been updated since the finalization of the Socio-Economic Effects Monitoring Plan based on the 2021 Census of Canada.

## **Context Indicators**

In this region, the Project is occurring in a predominantly rural area. The population of the communities traversed by the Project in this region is over 110,000 with a labour force of over 60,000, with a wider regional population of over 270,000 and regional labour force of over 190,000. There is other development in the region occurring, totaling over \$32.6 billion of capital investment. The current and anticipated Project workforce is small in the context of this region.
