### Introduction

This report presents the context indicators associated with the TMEP Coquihalla-Hope Region, updated to reflect the October to December (Q4) 2023 monitoring period. These data are from public and government sources. They reflect the overall socio-economic context within which Project construction is occurring and present a picture of the overall social and economic vulnerability or resiliency of the region related to the socio-economic monitoring topic areas. Data is being reported for the entire region, even though construction activity may only be occurring in a select portion of the region. These data will be updated during Project construction when new datata becomes available. This report also provides a one-time update of select community-level data points for communities crossed by the Project footprint that have been updated since the finalization of the Socio-Economic Effects Monitoring Plan based on the 2021 Census of Canada.

1 The Lower Mainland / Southwest Economic Region consists of: 4 regional districts; 14 cities, including Chilliwack, Abbotsford, Surrey, Coquitlam and Burnaby; 12 district municipalities, including Hope and Langley; 6 towns and villages; an Island Municipality; 96 Indian Reserves; and an Indian Government District. It is a grouping of complete census divisions created by Statistics Canada as a standard geographic unit for analysis of regional economic activity.
