Introduction

This report presents the context indicators associated with the TMEP Fraser Valley Region, updated to reflect the October to December (Q4) 2022 monitoring period. These data are from public and government sources. Data is being reported for the entire region, even though construction activity may only be occurring in a select portion of the region. Context Indicators

In this region, the Project area has a population of over 170,000 and a labour force of over 117,000, with a wider regional population of over 2.7 million and a wider regional labour force of over 1.8 million workers. There is notable other development in the region, with approximately \$1.2 billion of other capital projects under construction. The current and anticipated Project workforce is very small in the context of this region.

1 The Lower Mainland / Southwest Economic Region consists of: 4 regional districts; 14 cities, including Chilliwack, Abbotsford, Surrey, Coquitlam and Burnaby; 12 district municipalities, including Hope and Langley; 6 towns and villages; an Island Munici pality; 96 Indian Reserves; and an Indian Government District. It is a grouping of complete census divisions created by Statistics Canada as a standard geograph ic unit for analysis of regional economic activity.

COVID-19 numbers reflects change in government reporting; no longer reporting active cases.

All numbers are approximate. In certain instances (e.g., gender-based crimes), additional decimal spaces are shown in order to capture small numbers.
