## Qualitative Information Summary from Northern Health

February 2022 - Valemount clinic facing staffing shortage; 2 funded registered nurse positions are not filled. There is risk of facing intermittant clinic closures. Lack of available housing is hinding recruitment efforts. Current clinic staff workload is facing additional pressures as result of the pipeline workforce. Staff at clinic note 4 to 5 TMEP workforce per day visit the clinic. Sexually transmitted infection rates are presenting that are not characteristic of Valemount. After hours calls have increased.

May 2022 - Trans Mountain-funded registered nurses in place at Valemount clinic and working well.
