Introduction

This report presents the context indicators associated with the TMEP North Thompson Region, updated to reflect the October to December (Q4) 2023 monitoring period. These data are from public and government sources. They reflect the overall social and economic context within which Project construction is occurring and present a picture of the overall social and economic vulnerability or resiliency of the region related to the socio-economic monitoring topic areas. Data is being reported for the entire region, even though construction activity may only be occurring in a select portion of the region. These data will be updated during Project construction when new data becomes available. This report also provides a one-time update of select community-level data points for communities crossed by the Project footprint that have been updated since the finalization of the Socio-Economic Effects Monitoring Plan based on the 2021 Census of Canada.

Qualitative Information Summary from Northern Health

February 2022 - Valemount clinic facing staffing shortage; 2 funded registered nurse positions are not filled. There is risk of facing intermittent clinic closures. Lack of available housing is hindering recruitment efforts. Current clinic staff workload is facing additional pressures as result of the pipeline workforce. Staff at clinic note 4 to 5 TMEP workforce per day visit the clinic. Sexually transmitted infection rates are presenting that are not characteristic of Valemount. After hours calls have increased. May 2022 - Trans Mountain-funded registered nurses in place at Valemount clinic and working well.

December 2022 - Trans Mountain-funded registered nurse continued to provide enhanced capacity at Valemount community health clinic.

March 2023 - Trans Mountain-funded registered nurse continued to provide enhanced capacity at Valemount community health clinic.

Trans Mountain-funded registered nurse primarily attended to community resident health needs; community members account for about 77% of clients seen.

June 2023 - Trans Mountain funded registered nurse continued to provide enhanced capacity at Valemount community health clinic. Trans Mountain funded registered nurse primarily attended to community resident health needs; community members account for over 80% of clients seen.

August 2023 - Trans Mountain funded nurse continued to provide enhanced capacity at Valemount community health clinic until end-August 2023. Trans Mountain funded registered nurse primarily attended to community resident health needs; community members accounted for over 87% of clients seen.
