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Trans Mountain Pipeline ULC INTERIM POOLS

1. INTRODUCTION

As a minimum service level, Trans Mountain Pipeline ULC as general partner of Trans Mountain Pipeline L.P. ("**Trans Mountain**" or "**Carrier**") has six (6) crude pools. The crude petroleum pool criteria is provided in Section 1.4 of Trans Mountain's Service Standards Regarding the Transportation of Petroleum ("**Service Standards**").

Upon request from a Shipper, and at Trans Mountain's sole discretion, when operating conditions permit, Trans Mountain may accommodate additional crude pools on an interim basis (each an "**Interim Pool**"), subject to Rule 6.12.

This document provides details on Interim Pools including Interim Pool restrictions and criteria, supply, specifications, and petroleum segregation, interface management and quality testing and sampling.

After consultations with Shippers, Trans Mountain may amend the Service Standards to include the Interim Pool.

Capitalized terms that are not defined in this document are as defined in Trans Mountain's Tariff.¹

2. REQUIREMENTS OF INTERIM POOLS

Interim Pool Restrictions

If there is more than one Interim Pool and Trans Mountain is unable to accommodate all available Interim Pools in a Month, Trans Mountain will restrict the lowest nominated Interim Pool(s) for that Month. Trans Mountain will inform Shippers of any such restrictions after the Monthly Nomination Date for such Month. Shippers shall be permitted upon notice from Carrier to immediately revise or withdraw a Nomination where such Nomination does not contemplate an Interim Pool accepted for such Month.

Supply

Under normal operating conditions, Interim Pools will be supplied from third party direct inject facilities; however, if operating conditions permit and at the Carrier's sole discretion, the Carrier may elect to provide tankage for Interim Pools.

Quality

When considering petroleum segregation such as crossing bottoms and tank topping, as well as interface management and quality testing and sampling, Interim Pools will be treated similar to Segregated Heavy Crude as provided in section 3 of the Service Standards.

3. INTERIM POOLS

Interim Pools will be reviewed periodically and, at Trans Mountain's sole discretion, will continue as Interim Pools or be terminated. Prior to a termination of an Interim Pool, Trans Mountain will endeavor to provide notice sixty (60) days prior to the Monthly Nomination Date of the Month for which the change(s) would take effect.

Trans Mountain has approved the following Interim Pools:
